# IEEE Journals

- Types of journals
  - Letters
  - Transactions (Regular Paper & Correspondence)
  - Magazine
- Each has a different purpose, expectation, and requirement

# IEEE Journals

## ■ Letters

- IEEE Comm. Letters, IEEE Wireless Comm. Letters, IEEE Signal Processing Letters, etc.
- 4-5 pages
- Very quick review (4-6 weeks) and publication (6 months)
- Accept interesting, novel, well-investigated single idea, and crisply-written manuscript

# IEEE Journals

- Transactions
  - IEEE Trans. Comm., IEEE Trans. Wireless Comm., IEEE Trans. Signal Processing, IEEE Trans. Vehicular Tech., etc.
  - IEEE J. Selected Areas in Comm., IEEE J. Selected Topics in Signal Processing (accept special issues only)
  - 10-15 pages (Regular), 5-6 pages (Correspondence)
  - Review time 3 months, publication 1-2 years

# IEEE Journals

- Transactions (cont.)
  - Accept complete and technically sound work, composed of multiple ideas or extension of a single idea, with noticeable contribution to the field
  - Correspondence is shorter than Regular Paper but establishes noticeable contribution as well, and will go through the same review process

# IEEE Journals

## ■ Magazine

- IEEE Comm. Magazine, IEEE Vehicular Tech. Magazine, etc.
- Requirements vary
- Accept tutorial and survey papers with authors' own contribution to the topic (possibly from previous publications)
- Citations and visibility may be good

# IEEE Journals

## ■ General expectations

- Significance
  - Novelty
- } Contribution

### ■ Technical depth

- Mathematical rigorousness, comparison with related work, etc.

### ■ Organization and presentation

- Fluidity, clarity, language use
- Weighs 30-40% of the whole package

# IEEE Journals

- Process from submission to publication
  - Receive decision 3 months after submission
    - Minor Revision, Major Revision, Rejection
    - Decision is made based on 3 or more independent Reviewers' comments and to Editor's discretion
  - If Minor or Major Revision, prepare a point-by-point response to Reviewers' Comments along with the revised manuscript, then submit for another round of review (2-3 months)

# IEEE Journals

- Process from submission to publication (cont.)
  - If Rejection, you may (or may not) resubmit to the same journal
    - Resubmit to the same journal as a new submission, along with a point-by-point response to Reviewers' Comments
    - Alternatively, submit to another journal (no obligation (although encouraged) to address Reviewers' Comments from the previous round of review)

# IEEE Journals

- Process from submission to publication (cont.)
  - Usually go through 2-3 rounds of review
  - Your paper will be accepted if Reviewers' Comments are satisfactorily addressed, and the manuscript properly revised
  - Receive acceptance notification about 8-10 months after initial submission
  - Now the paper is “in press”

# IEEE Journals

- Process from submission to publication (cont.)
  - You will work with IEEE Staff Editor in the publication process
    - Submit source files (TEX, images EPS, etc.)
    - Prepare author bios and photos (for Regular Transactions)
    - Read Proof
    - Pay for page charges, if any

# IEEE Conferences

- Conferences are venues to present new work, gain visibility, and meet people
- IEEE sponsored international conferences
  - ICC, GLOBECOM, WCNC, VTC, PIMRC, ICASSP, etc.
  - Most are held annually, some twice a year (VTC)
  - Deadlines around September and March
  - 5-6 pages (most) or 4 pages (some)

# IEEE Conferences

- IEEE sponsored international conferences (cont.)
  - Accept papers with a good idea or useful applications
  - Review time about 3 months (one round only)
  - Decision is made based on 3 independent Reviewers' Comments and to Technical Program Committee's discretion
    - Acceptance, Rejection

# IEEE Conferences

- If paper is accepted
  - No obligation (although encouraged) to address all Reviewers' Comments
  - Pay registration fee
  - Prepare a PowerPoint for oral presentation, or a poster
  - Make travel plans (hotel, air tickets, visa, etc.)
  - Rehearse your presentation
